ECHO MOLST for Individuals with Intellectual or Developmental Disabilities (I/DD)

Who should attend? MD/DOs, NPs, PAs, RNs, Social Workers, NYS OPWDD staff & all others who participate in the MOLST process for individuals with I/DD - clinics are open to all!

Upon completion the 8-week ECHO MOLST for Individuals with I/DD clinic series, attendees will:

- Recognize the Surrogate Court Procedures Act (SCPA) §1750-b process outlined on the OPWDD legal requirements checklist & know when & how it needs to be completed before the MOLST can be signed by a physician
- Explain how SCPA §1750-b differs from the Family Healthcare Decisions Act; Use MOLST appropriately for individuals with I/DD
- Describe the differences between standard medical care, advance directives & MOLST; Utilize a standardized 8-Step MOLST protocol
- Recognize the value of health care proxy completion for individuals with I/DD
- Improve their comfort level with end-of-life conversations with individuals with I/DD & their family members & caregivers
